Forklift Seats - A seat is a strong, strong surface to sit upon, usually raised above floor level. Normally used by a single individual, most seats are supported by four legs, although a few could be in a triangular shape utilizing just three legs. A stool is a kind of seat that does not have any arm rests or a back rest. A seat that has folding action and an inclining footrest is called a recliner, while a seat along with arms only is considered an arm seat. When a seat has attached wheels, it could be called a wheelseat and if the seat is hung from above, it is referred to as a swing. A permanently attached seat in a theatre or a train is called a seat or airline seat, yet when riding; it is a saddle as in bicycle saddle. A car seat is the kind found inside vehicles and an infant car seat would be a seat specially intended for young children.

The design of the seat could vary rather considerably so as to accommodate numerous aesthetic tastes and requirements. As an example, designs could be decorated with drilled openings, could consist of low backs or gaps for ventilation or be made of porous materials. The seat back could be designed as an included headrest by extending the height over the occupant's head. Seats can be made together with an attached, built in footrest or come with a separate matching ottoman. An ottoman is a short stool which is designed to be used as a movable footrest. Every so often the ottoman can be mounted to a glider chair with swing arms, allowing the ottoman to rock back and forth with the glider like a rocking chair along with a built-in footrest.

Seat covers are temporary cloth covers used for a seat that could offer protection against wear and add beauty. A huge range of seat covers from leather to neoprene are now accessible. More formal materials could be rented for occasions like for instance weddings in order to increase the decoration. Various seat covers have decorative seat ties or ribbons connected to be tied at the rear of the seat in a bow or decorative knot. Some individuals utilize customized clear plastic furniture covers in order to protect their pricey sofas and seats.

Seat pads provide cushioning for hard seats, even if some are normally decorative. Several can even be used to be able to increase a driver's height within motor vehicles. In addition, orthopaedic backrests offer lumbar and lower spine support. Some makers have their seat pad designs patented and are recognized by some medical associations. A few of the newer car seats on the market are equipped together with built-in and adjustable lumbar supports to provide additional ease to passengers as well as drivers of the vehicle.
